Toxic Anterior Segment Syndrome (TASS) has emerged as an important issue for Canadian ophthalmologists, with several Canadian surgical centres reporting outbreaks in the last few years. TASS is characterized by sterile inflammation usually presenting within one or two days after uneventful cataract surgery.

COS has established a task force chaired by Dr. Simon Holland to help investigate and manage TASS outbreaks in Canada. The TASS task force will also be responsible for providing information and assistance for emerging and/or infectious disorders such as diffuse lamellar keratitis (DLK). Your help is needed in identifying and tracking cases of TASS. Please take time to report the occurrence of TASS or other infectious disorders to the task force using the form below.
