The Department is an important part of University of Toronto fellowships in Vitreo-retinal surgery, Glaucoma, and Neuro-Ophthalmology and is widely regarded as among the best fellowship training programs in North America and beyond. Our graduates are in practice and serve their communities all over the country and the world and bring renown and pride to the Sunnybrook and the University of Toronto names where they reside.

As a premier Academic Health Sciences Centre, Sunnybrook is committed to high quality inter-professional education and is the home of one of the University's four Academies for undergraduate medical education in addition to providing postgraduate and fellowship training in virtually all disciplines.
