The Waterloo Regional Eye program is recruiting a full-time ophthalmologist with **cornea subspecialty training** to the Department of Surgery at Saint Mary's General Hospital to provide the highest quality medical and surgical care to patients in our community. The successful candidate will have regular surgical time at the hospital and at our off-site surgical centre, minor procedure room time, laser clinic time, and access to hospital-based diagnostics.

The successful applicant will join our team of 10 ophthalmologists in Kitchener-Waterloo and will provide regional consultation and on-call services alongside the 16 other ophthalmologists in the Waterloo Wellington Region. The applicant is expected to provide medical and surgical cornea care for patients in our community.
