The Department of Ophthalmology at Queen's University is seeking an Academic Comprehensive Surgical Ophthalmologist. Qualified applicants will hold an MD degree (or equivalent) with specialty training in ophthalmology. Successful candidates must be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario and preference will be given to applicants who have specialty certification from the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) or the American Board of Specialties.

The successful candidate will be a comprehensive medical ophthalmologist. They will be expected to provide the breadth of care within medical ophthalmology including but not limited to seeing and caring for routine cornea, retina, glaucoma, oculoplastics, uveitis, and neuro-ophthalmology cases but will not be expected to perform incisional surgery. As such, there will not be any associated operating room time with this position.

While this will be mostly a clinical position, being an academic position, the successful candidate is expected to: provide teaching to medical students, residents and fellows; be involved in research; as well as perform some of the various administrative tasks required of the Department (leadership roles, committees, etc.). Regardless of subspecialty, comprehensive ophthalmology call coverage is expected and shared amongst the members of the Department in an equitable manner.

The Department also has an excellent residency program in Ophthalmology (with 12-13 residents). The Department enjoys an excellent reputation for employing innovative and enthusiastic teachers for learners at all levels. Preference will be given to applicants who have a strong track record or exhibit strong potential for clinical, surgical, and didactic teaching.

The Department is involved in new models of eye care delivery (including e-Consults, tele-ophthalmology, and remote real-time diagnostics). The Department has a strong research culture. While this will be a busy clinical position, opportunities to collaborate in research exist for those who are highly motivated and interested in doing so.

Queen's University is recognized nationally for the quality of its undergraduate and graduate programs, which attracts outstanding students. Queen's University is an integral part of the vibrant Kingston community in the heart of the Thousand Islands region of southeastern Ontario.
